A Message from our Provincial Grand Master



Welcome to the Festival Edition of the Surrey Keystone and the launch of our new Surrey 2022 Mark Benevolent Fund website <http://www.surrey2022mbf.org.uk> which has information on the Festival finale to be held at the Copthorne Effingham Park Hotel, Gatwick, Surrey, RH10 3EU, on the weekend of the 1st & 2nd July 2022.

I have the honour of being the President of the 154th Festival for the Mark Benevolent Fund. I look forward to welcoming you to Surrey and on the web site you will find information regarding all the activities we have planned for the weekend.

The Festival Banquet will be held at the Copthorne Effingham Park Hotel, RH10 3EU on Saturday 2nd July 2022 and hotel accommodation has been reserved at a special price of £100 per night for those attending the banquet. We have also reserved hotel rooms at their sister hotel, the Copthorne Hotel London Gatwick, Copthorne Common, RH10 3PG, at the same price. The hotels are part of the Millennium Hotels Group and are less than 2 miles apart



Free car parking is available at both hotels. Coach transfers will be provided for those staying at the Copthorne Hotel London Gatwick. For those wishing to travel by train Three Bridges Station is less than 10 minutes away and London Gatwick Airport is under 15 minutes.

On the web site you will find details of the Festival Banquet to be held on the 2nd July 2022. This will be preceded by a drinks reception and followed by entertainment provided by the West End Jerseys.

On the Friday evening we have arranged a BBQ at the Copthorne Effingham Park Hotel and this is also available to those staying elsewhere. Entertainment will be provided by Jahson Nembhard, a singer entertainer and former lead singer with the Drifters.

On the Saturday there are trips from the hotels by coach to:

- (i) A leisurely tour of Denbies Vineyard and wine tasting
- (ii) A trip into the world of gin at the Silent Pool
- (iii) Leonardslee Lakes and Gardens, a Grade 1 Listed Garden.

Entertainment and dancing will commence from 7:00pm when Jahson Nembhard, formerly of The Drifters, will kick off the party.

Saturday 2nd July

Having enjoyed a sumptuous breakfast, if you haven't booked onto one of the excursions you are free to enjoy the delights of Surrey and its close environs. Or maybe you would like to travel to London, less than one hour away or Brighton only ½ hour using the Gatwick Express.

Whatever you choose to do, the evening reception will commence at 6:30 pm with a complimentary drink on arrival. There are several bars where you can meet friends and entertain guests prior to the Festival Banquet which will start at 7:30pm.



The dinner will be followed by a few short speeches before the festival result is announced. At 10:00pm the party moves up a gear with entertainment from and dancing to the West End Jerseys.

Denbies Vineyard Tour and Wine Tasting



South East England is the fertile home for three quarters of the UK's wine production and we're fortunate enough to have one such vineyard right here in the Surrey Hills – along with a charming restaurant and a gift shop full of tempting goodies.

Surrounded by stunning scenery, it's easy to understand why Denbies became a favourite coffee haunt for actress Virginia McKenna and other celebrities. One of the most prized post-lockdown days out on offer.

Following an indoor winery tour, guests can take an outdoor vineyard trip using the quaint in-house electric train with also a little al fresco courtyard wine tasting.

Denbies' wines are produced from a variety of grapes suited to cool-climate wine production and classic varieties such as Pinot Noir and Chardonnay but half of Denbies' wine production is devoted to producing the most tempting sparkling wines.

Silent Pool Distillery and Gin Tasting

If a day focussed purely on nature in our lovely part of Surrey is more to your liking, this breath-taking former chalk quarry, fed by underground springs which were a precious source of clean water in days gone by, is now a little place of peace and almost eerie beauty adored by the discerning, nature-loving visitor. Be intrigued by the Silent Pool legend involving a woodcutter's daughter and a prince.

This tranquil beauty spot is now home to the Silent Pool Gin Distillery. You can take a 90-minute gin experience tour, where staff explain how Silent Pool Gin first came to life, as well as offering some history on how gin was originally made and how, over hundreds of years, it remained popular, and is in still demand right up to the present day.

The Silent Pool staff will describe why their unique blend of 24 botanicals makes their tippie the very best. At the end of your day, you can decide upon that for yourself by sampling a little of what is on offer – you could say, gin-credible!

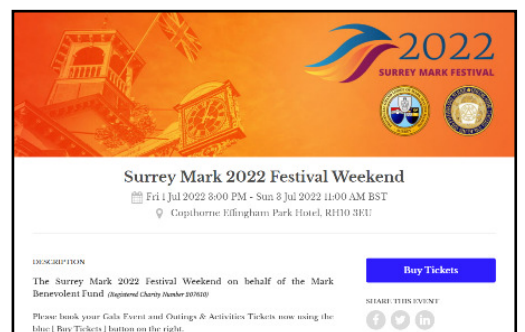

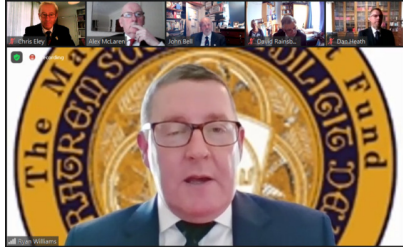

Congratulations to East Lancashire on a spectacular Festival Result

The Mark Province of East Lancashire has reached the conclusion of their 2021 Festival for the benefit of the Mark Benevolent Fund. Like us, it had been overshadowed by the Covid-19 pandemic, which no-one could ever have imagined.

They were disappointed that their Festival Banquet had been cancelled as a result of the extension of Covid prevention measures, but all the disappointment paled into insignificance as their Festival total was revealed.



At a zoom meeting held to announce the result, the Grand Secretary, RW.Bro. Ryan Williams, revealed the total to be a magnificent **£1,020,603**. Over one million pounds; a magnificent total particularly having regard to the ravages of the pandemic.

This incredible result has been achieved by the support of the entire Constitution, but was principally down to the generosity and efforts of the Mark Masons of East Lancashire. The Provincial Grand Master, RW.Bro. Alex McLaren, thanked each and

Nigel's Sponsored Walk

W.Bro. Nigel Feltham was due to take part in the famous Nijmegen Walk in July 2020 and then again in 2021 in support of our Surrey 2022 MBF Festival, but the best laid plans of mice and men.... So, he is now going to complete an alternative march over the same days around Surrey from the 20th to the 23rd July.



In the intervening time Nigel has been rather poorly having been diagnosed with polymyalgia rheumatica so this will be quite a personal challenge for him.

A few years back Nigel was getting pains in his wrist. After two years of NHS physio and consultations it was concluded that he had tendinitis in that wrist. He then had a steroid injection in the wrist, just before Covid-19 struck, and it all settled down. However 8 to 9 months later he was getting tired in the afternoons, his arms, neck back and muscles were all aching. It got to the stage after his 60th birthday that he struggled to walk down the garden, get out of bed, sleep, even lifting himself out of the bath was an effort. Life was not good, physically or mentally.

Further tests were done ... an MRI scan and bloods ... they thought he had a torn rotator cuff... thankfully not. His wife Nicola (also a physio) had been tirelessly treating his neck, back and shoulders. She couldn't understand why Nigel was not getting better... Then one day she said, do you know what "I think you may have PMR". The next day Nigel had private blood tests done and 24 hours later the results confirmed this. The results were passed on to his GP and Nigel was referred to a rheumatologist. He was put on a course of steroids, had more scans, blood tests, and bone density scans.

The result Nigel is walking again... relatively pain free, albeit a bit of pain in his knuckles and shoulders. To look at him you wouldn't think there's anything wrong but internally and emotionally he was broken. Yes, Nigel went private for some results ... but he would like to thank the NHS for all their support and care now that he has the correct diagnosis. Nigel will be on steroids for the next few months, reducing the dosage each month and hopefully he will eventually be off them totally.

Nigel says " *This walk will be a big challenge for me most people know I love my walking ...especially long distances. The walk will let me know how far I have progressed with my recovery. I will complete the walk over four days maybe not as fast as I usually go*".
