



Congratulations Nigel Nijmegen Walk 2024

Well done Nigel for completing your 9th Nijmegen March from the 16th to the 19th of July to raise funds for our Provincial Grand Master's preferred charity, the Prostate Project.

The International Four Day Marches Nijmegen, or in Dutch, *Internationale Vierdaagse Afstandsmarsen Nijmegen*, is the largest multiple day marching event in the world. It is organised every year in Nijmegen, Netherlands, in mid-July as a means of promoting sport and exercise. Participants walk 19 miles, 25 miles, or 31 miles daily, depending on their age and gender and, on completion, receive a royally approved medal, Vierdaagsekruis.

Nigel says, "Last year I walked for the Prostate Project as they were raising funds for a 'Man Van' -a mobile Unit to do PSA testing, which has now been purchased. This year it needs to be kitted out and become operational. The Surrey Mark Executive had asked me to help raise funds for our Provincial Grand Master's chosen charity, and I was happy to take on the challenge".

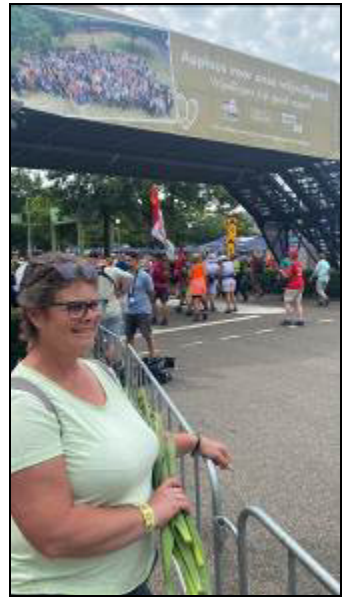

Cricket: As explained to a foreigner...
